


Minutes of the Meeting


- The Chair Dr. T. Sasipraba welcomed the constitution members and introduced the new Dean School of Science and Humanities Dr. Rekha Chakravarthy to the members present in the meeting.
- The meeting started with the review of the previous meeting. The action taken report were analysed and ratified.
- The IQAC Dean Dr. Anima Nanda presented the agenda of the meeting.
- The meeting started with the discussion to devise the new Regulations 2023. The Chair insisted the Deans and Heads to take up the points such as New Era of education, Academic flexibility, and Multi-disciplinary education in line with NEP 2020. The suggestions by the members are given below:
 - Dr. B.Bharathi, Dean Academics asked the departments to initiate the stake holders feedback for framing the curriculum. The curriculum should be designed based on skill, entrepreneurship, experiential learning, project based learning and design thinking not only for Engineering students but also for the students of Arts & Science.
 - Dr. E. John Bruce, Dean Placement and Corporate Affairs, suggested the Deans and Heads to include aptitude training, soft skill training & technical skill training as a part of the curriculum.
 - The Chair insisted the departments to concentrate on SDGs, as we need to follow all the goals and request the departments to concentrate to relevant goals so as to have sustainable future.
- The Chair insisted the Deans and Heads about the implementation of Minor degree, Major degree, Twinning, dual degrees and Integrated M.E, M.Tech and M.Sc Programs. The following discussions were highlighted:




- Dr. T.Sasikala, Dean, School of Computing recommended in introducing degree programs in association with corporate to be considered which adds weightage during the placement.
- Dr. T.Sasikala & Dr. N.M.Nandhitha Dean, School of Electrical and Electronics suggested on having programming courses mandatory for non-computing students which helps them during the placement and also that can be included as a Minor degree for the students.
- Dr. Igni Sabasti Prabhu, Controller of Examination discussed about the flexibility of slots in implementing the Major and Minor degree and credit transfer for NPTEL courses. He also requested the Dean Academics to finalize the rubrics for Project Phase I evaluation and prepare common template to evaluate the students for the same.
- Dr. Sathish, Head, Chemical Engineering mentioned that student should provide a publication acceptance in UGC CARE journals/Scopus Indexed/Web of Science as a part in Project Phase I which helps them for streamlining their career in higher studies too.
- The Chair suggested the department Heads to frame new programmes which improves the admission rate for integrated programmes.
- Dean Academics informed the department Heads to inform the students about the twinning programmes, so that the student can be benefitted in various aspects.
- The Chair informed that the institution has signed a MoU with **NATIVE LEAD** which offers a new course towards innovation and entrepreneurship in online for the students which helps in bringing out new ideas amongst them for Startups. After considerable discussions by the Heads and Deans, it was finalized to offer this new course as Value Added course for final year students and credit course for second year and third year students.



- To enhance the Teaching Learning Methods the Chair requested the Heads to depute 1 faculty member from each department to visit IIT-M for participating in a faculty development programme.
- The Dean Academics requested the department Heads to identify the students and prepare them for various competitions/hackathons and other events listed in Agenda 4.
- The Chair appreciated the Computer Science Engineering, Electrical and Electronics Engineering and Biotechnology departments on submitting the SSR for ABET and she insisted other departments to apply for various accreditations.
- Inline to the Agenda 6, the Chair suggested having a department wise Program Coordinator to enhance the student learning experience, monitor the implementation of program policies, practice of OBE, pedagogical initiatives, department activities and to perculate the quality at all levels in the department. The roles and responsibilities of the Program Coordinator were also described in the meeting. The details of the Department Program Coordinator have to be submitted in VC office on or before Saturday 16th July, 2022.
- The Dean IQAC highlighted the findings of Internal Administrative and Academic Audit (AAA) conducted on 15th to 17th June, 2022. The audit report was discussed in the meeting and she informed the Deans & Heads of various schools to submit the pending documents to Ms. Vijayashree.T, Dr. Susitra and Dr. Godwin Premi on or before 21st July. She also insisted to keep the documents ready for External Audit which is planned by September 2022. The Chair requested the Dean Academics to prepare the audit calendar and circulate to the department for ensuring the proper mechanism of documentation and internal communication.
- Dr. Godwin Premi requested the departments to provide the data for newsletter and the Chair suggested few points to be added in the newsletter to increase the preception of the institution.



- Dean IQAC requested the department to submit the data for the preparation of AQAR 2021-2022 on or before 19th July, 2022. As the NAAC accreditation 3rd cycle is impending, the department heads were requested to verify the data with Ms. Vijayashree.T on or before 26th July, 2022.
- The Chair informed about the Sscore version 2, which reflects the addition of points including the faculty support for students in various activities, department coordinators for accreditation, faculty handling ODL courses.
- The citation index of the institution has to be increased and therefore the Dean IQAC highlighted the importance of the same and mentioned that it would improve the funding opportunities from various Government bodies. The Chair requested the deans and heads to insist the faculty members to cite the paper relevant to their specialization and increase the citation index.
- The Dean IQAC informed the department heads to give the list of newly inducted faculty members and faculty with less than 5 years' experience for conducting the faculty induction program.
- The Chair insisted the department heads to provide the data in the formats shared with them for ARIIA submission on or before 23rd July, 2022.
- The Chair informed the department heads to initiate the Chair Professor and conduct activities under the same. She suggested every school to plan for the chair professor and bring the structure on Monday 18th July, 2022.
- The Chair informed about the formulation of new Faculty guidelines for attending Professional Development activities



• The Chair was delighted to inform the establishment of Centre for Advanced Studies for Innovation and Technology transfer. The Deans are asked to inform their department faculty members to utilize the facility available and come up with new ideas of innovation and file more design / product patents.



ACTION TAKEN REPORT FOR THE ACADEMIC YEAR 2022-23

- The primary objective accomplished during the 2022–2023 academic year was the Institute's accreditation with NAAC A++ grade and a score of 3.73. The institution successfully submitted te SSR and DVV to achieve the abovesaid grade. The organization is also proud of the National Institutional Ranking Framework placed this university in 51st place among Indian universities. Sathyabama is listed in the 1001–1200 Band of the QS World University Rankings and placed among 41 Indian institutions. The institution was awarded with 5 Star Rating in the QS rating. In QS Asia University Rankings it stood in 301-350 Band. The Times Higher Education Impact Rankings also ranked Sathyabama in 601-800 band in 2022. And Times Higher Education World University Rankings 2023 -The Institution is ranked in 1201-1500 position. The faculty's efforts should be increased, as indicated by the comparison of this year's NIRF Ranking with the previous seven years.
- Submission of AQAR 2021- 2022
- Eleven departments received NBA accreditation; three of those have successfully undergone reaccreditation, while the remaining departments are in the process.
- The departments, like CSE, EEE, and Bio Technology had successfully submitted the data for ABET accreditation followed by visit for same.
- The curriculum revision for the academic year 2023–24 is evaluated, and a significant revision is made while taking into account the Multi-disciplinary education in line with NEP 2020 and SDG measures, as well as the addition of minor degrees and honors. Faculty induction programmes were arranged to get awareness on NEP and SDGs. Introduced 3 credit course is introduced exclusively for skill development in all engineering programmes, Credit based courses are included under employment enhancement program.
 - Faculty training for NEN Ignite a course on entrepreneurship is conducted in order to handle the same course for the students



- Departments are encouraged to organize value added courses to empower the students
- New programmes were introduced like Bachelor of Physiotherapy, Master of Law in IPR, Constitutional Law and Criminal Law are introduced along with Integrated M.E. and M.Sc. programmes.
 - Specialization Programmes under B.E. Computer Science and Engineering were successfully introduced on programmes like Artificial Intelligence, Artificial Intelligence and Machine Learning, Artificial Intelligence and Robotics, Block Chain Technology, Cyber Security, Data Science, Internet of Things
- The establishment of Centre for Advanced Studies for Innovation and Technology transfer. It is established with state of art equipment for a quality research in material science and artificial intelligence on Experiential learning is practiced in Metaverse, 3D printing and Drone Experimentarium
- Towards the placement aptitude training, soft skill training & technical skill training were included as a part of the curriculum.
- Conducted Certificate Programmes/ Workshops/ Faculty DevelopmentProgrammes / Short-term courses for faculties and students
- The institution has signed MoU with NATIVE LEAD which offers a new course towards innovation and entrepreneurship in online for the students which helps in bringing out new ideas amongst them for Startups.
- Events on the G20 forum, Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav, energy efficiency, sustainability, women's empowerment, inclusive development, cultural pride, and lifestyle for the environment (LiFE) were successfully conducted.
- Mandate guest lecture from industry expert for the courses were organized and DAC and PAC members assessed the quality of the CAE question papers.
- Impact factor and citation index of the Institute have led to a rise in the quantity of highquality publications. Significant increase in the indexed publication of the institute of Scopus gone to 11404 with h-Index 81 and Web of science of 5539 articles with h-Index 71 and the highest impact factor of one article raised to 19.2 this year. On Teacher's Day, faculty members who publish in high-impact factor journals received



recognition for their contributions.

- On SDG the institution ranked among the top 1406 Institution in the World.
